5. Read Revelation 15:3-4. List the characteristics of God that you see there, and define each one.
6. Read Luke 15:11-32. How does the younger son treat his father in verses 11-13? What can we infer about his beliefs regarding his father's character (what did he think his father was like)?
7. In verses 14-19, what does the younger son realize about his father's character?
8. In verses 20-24, what does the younger son learn about his father's character?
9. In verses 25-32, what is the difference between the older son's character and the father's character?
